Yard:

Always supervise children in or near water (pools, streams, puddles, etc.).

Store tools, garden and lawn-care equipment and supplies in a locked closet or shed.

☐ Do not use a power mower to cut the lawn while children are close by.

Children should not play on treated lawns for at least 48 hours following an application of a fertilizer or pesticide.

☐ Know the types of trees on the property in the event that a child eats berries, leaves or other plant life.

When you barbecue, never leave children unattended around the grill.

☐ Store propane grills where children cannot reach the knobs.

Home play structures and play areas should be inspected regularly for broken parts, glass and other dangerous debris. Structures should be promptly fixed should damage be found.
